For Export from Lebanon

Prohibited items: (not exhaustive list / most common prohibited items)

- 1. Substances and material that have indecent and immoral content
- 2. All types of narcotics
- 3. Explosives, arms, part of arms and ammunitions, sharp objects (knives, machetes, etc...) without a preapproved document (see below restrictions)

Prohibited valuable assets

- 1. Coins
- 2. Credit cards
- 3. All kinds of account & check books
- 4. Precious stones and high value jewelry including but not limited to gold, silver, platinum, and gems

Restrictions: (not exhaustive list / most common items that need preapproval)

- 1. License/number plates (sender has to be personally present in the customs offices in Beirut Sorting Center in order to send it)
- 2. Passports: from the General Directorate of General Security
- 3. Publications: from the General Directorate of General Security
- 4. Tobacco and electronic cigarettes: from Lebanon's Tobacco Regulatory Authority (refer below to prohibitions by country)
- 5. Pharmaceutical drugs, medications and food supplements: from the Ministry of Public Health (refer below to prohibitions by country)
- 6. Cosmetic products: from the Ministry of Public Health (refer below to prohibitions by country)
- 7. Laboratory substances for testing: from the Ministry of Public health
- 8. Any food stuff exceeding the minimum thresh hold: from the Ministry of Commerce (refer below to prohibitions by country)
- 9. Any chemical substance: from a local chemical expert
- 10. Plants and seeds: from the Ministry of Agriculture (refer below to prohibitions by country)
- 11. Explosives, Arms, part of arms and ammunitions, sharp objects (knife, machetes, etc.): from the Ministry of Interior and from the Ministry of Defense

"Export" Notes:

- General terms for the minimum threshold:
 - One or many packages including commercial goods addressed to one consignee in a one single customs clearance day and having a value exceeding one million Lebanese pounds (1,000,000 LBP including the postage fee) requires a customs declaration via a forwarding agent (Transitaire)
 - The minimum threshold for items declared as gift is 200,000 LBP
- Items packaging:
 - All sharp tools or substances that cause pollution or damage to mail should be packaged according to the content nature
 - Example: Any authorized liquid with a limited quantity should be well packaged with bubble wrap and inserted in a wooden box
- Airline security:
 - Clients are requested to abide by the airlines security guides avoiding the transportation of any:
 - Flammable liquids and gases such as:
 - Perfume
 - Aftershave
 - Acetone
 - Glue
 - Paint, Thinner, Solvent
 - Gasoline, Gas lighter
 - Alcohol
 - Corrosive material
 - Toxic and infectious substances
 - Electronic goods <u>including</u> lithium batteries
